ommittee membership and leader-portant part of getting things done in our community. The CCA Board is in the process of documenting the role of each Standing Committee. Below are a few of the committees that have been finalized, and are still looking for volunteers. Additional committee descriptions will be available in the coming months. Stay tuned and please consider donating some of your time to help your friends and neighbors to build a stronger Charlotte community. Send a note to get into volved!

Communications Committee: This team will plan and implement effective internal and external systems that support responsive, interactive, and timely modes of communication between the board and community members using a variety of media outlets; assess the usefulness of media options currently used and make recommendations regarding their disposition as well as suggest potential new applications.

Safety and Security Committee: Our neighborhood must be a safe, vibrant,

and inviting place to live, work and visit. This committee fosters neighborly relationships & effective communication between residents, schools, churches and businesses in the neighborhood while working with various agencies (City of Rochester Police Department, City of Rochester Fire Department, Monroe County Sheriff's Office, Town of Greece Police Department, Town of Irondequoit Police Department, U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Regional Transportation Service, etc.) to ensure everyone's safety and well-being.

Neighborhood Planning & Zoning Committee: This team will act as an interface between the CCA and the City of Rochester on community development issues. It will establish a positive and productive working relationship with City officials on behalf of the Charlotte community. It will proactively involve volunteers to attend meetings, collect and share information, and advocate for the community's best interests. Ideally, team members will have a diversity of backgrounds and perspectives that will provide a well-rounded, broad representation of our community as a whole. An essential

component of this team's responsibility is community outreach and advocacy. The team will conduct a needs assessment within the community to establish a current priority list. It will also outreach to the Rochester Regional Community Design Center (RRCDC) as a resource to help Charlotte create a neighborhood vision plan (charrette). The data collected from the community needs assessment will be used to inform the vision plan process. The team will also outreach to other neighborhood groups to investigate potential partnership opportunities and to benchmark Charlotte initiatives with those of other communities.

NEIGHBORHOOD PLANNING & ZONING COMMITTEE UPDATE

On Monday January 12, 2015, the City Planning Commission (CPC) approved a three year Special Permit (until January 31, 2018) for Lakesiders Bar and Grill, located at 4783-4785 Lake Avenue, to re-establish live entertainment; specifically trivia games, karaoke, DJs and small bands, with hours of operation from 2:00PM to 2:00AM, daily. A condition on this Special Permit is for all exterior doors, except for the front door located near Lake Avenue, shall remain closed at all times during all live entertainment. #

UPDATE ON THE MARINA SITE DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

here are still unanswered questions concerning why Pike Construction and the City of Rochester have parted ways. With the upcoming bid for Contract 2 of the cannot be resolved, Mr. Brown believes that the full ma-Marina construction, the contractors at the recent bid review conference ask why the two entities parted ways. The city staff offered no explanation.

Bill Brown, a CCA member who has extensively researched the marina development project, has continued his efforts to educate the community and City Council about the site soil conditions. He continues to restate those conditions with the following: "The site

soils are a mixture of regulated, contaminated cap material, with a variety of soft soils at the next layer, completely flooded with water." He goes on to say, "When the regulated material mixes with the water, it becomes very corrosive". Also due to the extreme drop in elevation from Lake Avenue at 275 feet above sea level to the river bottom at 220 above sea level, there is a chance for

serious erosion during the construction." These conditions create very complex development issues. If they rina/development project could be jeopardized.

> Mr. Brown has referenced the City's own research as the primary source of his information as well as conversations with Dr. Richard Young of SUNY, Geneseo, who is a professor of geotechnology and an expert on the geology of the Genesee River.

At the City's Bidder's Conference last Tuesday, January 6th, 2015

there were a variety of questions asked concerning the site condition. You can see the full discussion of the site issues at Mr. Brown's website at . He also has

posted there a variety of other related documents to the marina geology site conditions and City of Rochester research documents. #

SPECIAL COMMITTEE FORMED TO ADDRESS CCA'S NOT-FOR-PROFIT STATUS

he CCA Board of Directors has established a new Not-for-Profit Status (NPS) Committee. The board approved the appointment of community member Jack McKie as chairperson and Clare **Stortini** as board liaison. For the past year, Clare has been serving on a similar committee for the Corn Hill Neighborhood Association and is well-versed in what is required. This Special (ad hoc) Committee is formed to ensure that the CCA upholds its membership and fiduciary responsibilities in accordance with New York State Not-for-Profit CorporationLaw (NPCL).

The team is specifically tasked to:

- Research and identify attorney(s) and accounting firm(s)/CPA who specialize in advising not for-profit organizations (NPOs).
- Confer with CCA attorney and accounting firm/CPA to review current level of compliance, the implications of such, and determine all potential costs to the organization to come into compliance with applicable laws.
- Determine potential cost to the organization to file changes to CCA Certificate of Incorporation with New York State.
- Create appropriate change in wording to the CCA Certificate of Incorporation (COI), CCA Mission & Vision Statements, and CCA Bylaws.
- Create Conflict of Interest Policy for Board of Directors and Committee Chairs in accordance with NYS Not-for-Profit Corporation Law (NPCL).




