

The board also seeks additional community volunteers to review nominations, vet qualified candidates and make recommendations to the board.





ello Charlotte and Happy Spring!
As the weather continues to get better and what snow we had melts, the inevitable leftovers of a Rochester winter manifest themselves as six months of debris and litter. In an effort to beautify our neighborhoods and get them ready for summer, our city is hosting its annual Clean Sweep on Saturday, April 30<sup>th</sup> and we are hopeful that you can join us for this wonderful event! Clean Sweep is a great way to meet your neighbors and make a visible difference in our neighborhoods. Additionally, to help maintain these efforts, I will also be sponsoring several mini-Sweeps during the summer and early fall throughout the Northwest quadrant. Keep an eye on our CCA newsletter for more information about all of these events.

You may also be aware that I am working to bring State, County and City officials together to assess and identify actions for improving the safety of motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists on Lake Avenue. We have had several incidents lately with fatalities and serious injuries, particularly in the Maplewood and Edgerton neighborhoods. Although these areas appear to be most impacted, if you use Lake Avenue regularly, I am sure that you have observed the problems with speeding and other reckless behavior exhibited throughout all the neighborhoods bordering this road. The issue is further complicated by the fact that Lake Avenue is a dedicated State road; Monroe County's Traffic Safety Board controls signage, parking and signal lights and the City helps with traffic enforcement, plowing and cleaning. With so many parties involved, we can suffer from a lack of coordination and oversight. My goal is to get everyone to the table and focus our resources to make significant safety improvements. If

A cross the country, the month of April is recognized as National Autism Awareness Month. This is an issue near and dear to my heart and I encourage everyone to take this opportunity to learn more about Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and how you can help support individuals with ASD and their families.

We learn more and more about ASD every day; its possible causes and its prevalence. This year, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that 1 in 68 children have been identified with ASD. This new estimate is roughly 30% higher than the previous estimate of 1 in 88 children reported in 2012. That is why it is necessary to learn as much about ASD as we can in order to keep up with its rapidly growing effect on families.

The personal experiences of several members of my staff who have children on the spectrum have broadened my understanding of the many challenges facing affected families. As part of the State Assembly, I remain committed to fighting for expanding services and funding for programs supporting these individuals and their families

It is important that we take time this month to celebrate and thank the many professionals, advocates, health-care workers and family members who are working tirelessly to making a difference in the lives of individuals with ASD. **Update: Monroe County Legislators Brian Marianetti and Tony Micciche** 

Legislature, Majority Leader Brian Marianetti and Legislator Tony Micciche were proud to pass a local law with overwhelming bipartisan support to create the Office of Public Integrity. County Executive Cheryl Dinolfo submitted the referral to the County Legislature on January 11<sup>th</sup>, delivering on her promise of a more open and transparent County government.

The Office of Public Integrity has been empowered with the following responsibilities: examine all County operations independently with the full authority to report findings to law enforcement; address concerns received from Monroe County residents; subpoena witnesses or information from any private vendor doing business with the County, including LDCs; conduct financial and operational investigations and audits of County departments; and provide recommendations to improve accountability and efficiency. The legislation ensures all whistleblowers are protected.

Over the coming weeks, County Executive Dinolfo will begin searching for the most qualified, independent, and impartial candidates to fill the position as the Office's director. That choice will be reviewed by the County Legislature and voted on before the new director can begin work. Legislators Marianetti and Micciche look forward to working with the County Executive on this new endeavor.

We are looking forward to continuing to pass legislation that helps Charlotte, a community that were are proud to represent in the County Legislature. # Information About International Joint Commission Plan 2014 **Discussed at March CCA Meeting**

dgemere Drive resident Dr. Dan Barletta, presented to CCA members on March 7, 2016 about the Lake Ontario Riparian Alliance (LORA) and their concerns with respect to the International Joint Commission (IJC) Plan 2014. LORA was formed in 1993 to protect and preserve the value of waterfront property. Their strategy of involving neighborhood associations, state, local and federal officials along with other interested organizations has enabled LORA to take a pro-active position in protecting the Lake Ontario shoreline. According to LORA, since about 1999, most Lake Ontario South Shore property owners have enjoyed fairly consistent regulation of water levels. This consistent regulation has meant that erosion and flooding of Lake, Bay & Pond property has been easy to control and has occurred at a manageable rate. LORA is very concerned the International Joint Commission has decided to change the way the level of Lake Ontario is controlled and believe that the new regulation plan

could mean serious property damage to those who live, work or make a living along the shores of Lake Ontario and its bays and ponds.

According to IJC's website, Plan 2014 is designed to provide for more natural variations of water levels of Lake Ontario and the St. Lawrence River that are needed to restore ecosystem health. It will continue to moderate extreme high and low levels, better maintain system-wide levels for navigation, frequently extend the recreational boating season and slightly increase hydropower production. More year-to-year variation in water levels improves coastal health.


