11 a.m. - 4 p.m.: Rediscover the Port.

News from the Leadership Academy for Young Men

Over the Summer:

- •The Leadership Academy grant writing team submitted a proposal to NYSED for school improvement funding. If approved, the Leadership Academy will receive greater resources over the next five years.
- •The Leadership Academy Varsity Basketball team won the championship in this year's summer league.
- •In late August, our JROTC cadets were asked to present the flags at two NFL games. Students travelled to NYC and Buffalo for these events. We are hoping more opportunities arise in the future.
- •Our new 7th graders participated in a week long orientation in late August. The program was focused on ELA and Math instruction, as well as character and leadership development.
- •Our entire teaching staff was recently trained by expert Dr. Susan Craig in trauma responsive schools.

•What's New This Year:

- •The "Time to Deliver" Campaign kicked off last week. Our revived mission is to provide a Safe, Fun/ Competitive, and Academically Challenging school for the young men in the city of Rochester.
- •The Leadership Academy is a model school for restorative practices. A large component of this work is the initiation of two help zones in our building. The Lions' Den and the Little Lions' Den are two rooms where students will be given an opportunity to take a break, reflect on challenges, and solve problems with adult guidance in preparation for class.
- •Project CRISS is a new program for our middle school



students. The focus is reading across core content areas. Students will receive direct guidance in developing study skills and organizational habits.

•Our JROTC program is expanding with all of our new 9th grade students participating in the character and leadership development curriculum during advisory time.

New & Continuing Partnerships:

- •Urban League of Rochester will continue to provide our 9th grade students college readiness services through the NY Gear Up Program.
- •Hillside Work Scholarship will continue their mentoring and work readiness program.
- •The Center for Youth will be providing crisis intervention services in our high school Lions' Den, a help zone where students will go when they need assistance.
- •The Open Door Mission is a new partnership that will be providing our school with clothing for students who need assistance with uniforms.
- •The University of Rochester's Minority Male Leadership Program will continue its partnership with the Leadership Academy students by providing tutoring and mentoring assistance to students in grades 10-12.
- •We will be working with the Holy Cross School on Lake Avenue to provide tutoring and reading assistance to younger students.
- •Many additional pending partnerships are still in progress.

Update: New York State Senate Joe Robach To Dall Channel Work State Senate

Tax Relief for New Yorkers

a result of our ongoing efforts to provide more relief to taxpayers, this year my colleagues in the Senate Majority and I delivered real outcomes for hardworking New Yorkers, including:

A Major New Middle-Class Income Tax Cut: This will reduce taxes by approximately \$4.2 billion for millions of middle-class New Yorkers, as well as for tens of thousands of small businesses. This broad-based tax cut will reduce middle-class tax rates by 20 percent, representing one of the largest income tax reductions in New York State (NYS) history.

Landmark Property Tax Rebate Check Plan: The Senate successfully renewed one of the largest property tax relief programs in NYS history, thereby ensuring that homeowners across the state will continue to see substantial property tax relief rebate checks this fall.

To make additional continuous progress, the State Assembly needs to follow the Senate's lead by approving the following measures:

At long last, the City administration has identified funding to complete the construction of the concession stand for the Charlotte Youth Athletic Association (CYAA) ball fields. As most of you know, this has been a project has been a long-time in coming; that was delayed due to a number of factors. The good news is that City staff are committed to start the project as soon as the funding has been approved; so fingers crossed, the community will be able to belly up to the counter next season! The criteria for the scholarship will be very similar to our own CCA scholarship, with emphasis on academics, community service etc. More details will follow.


