A Message from Jonathan, CCA President

e are happy to announce that the Board applied for 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status with the Internal Revenue Service on February 2, 2017 and it was approved on February 23, 2017. Thank you to everyone involved in this process. This will allow the Association to take advantage of several options. The biggest benefit of



obtaining 501(c)(3) status is exemption from federal taxes and sales taxes. The Association could also qualify for future grants; discounted advertising rates if we should ever decide to advertise locally for our functions; and even lower postage rates for mailing our monthly newsletter. With our new 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status, comes the requirement to file an annual 990-N tax filing with the IRS. We are preparing to file the required form with the help of our accountant by the due date of May 15, 2017. We're also preparing to file the necessary documents to be acknowledged as a non-profit with the State of New York. The tax-exempt non-profit status could also encourage donations by providing donors with a tax deduction.

Recently, the Association has added a PayPal option to our website for members and sponsor to renew their membership/sponsorship directly through our website. These changes will strengthen the Association and help continue the services that the Association provides to the community. The Association's most important committees and significant annual financial commitments are for gardening/landscaping, funding scholarships, and community communication. As we strengthen these commitments, please consider joining one of these committees.

Our most urgent need now is volunteers. We ask that you visit our website at www.charlottecca.org to view all of our current committees and consider joining as a committee member; or, even consider making a one-time donation to the Association while renewing your membership online. We can only be successful if we continue to work together to keep Charlotte the beautiful, safe and vibrant place we call home.



t's that time of year again when college-bound seniors start their search for financial aid. The Charlotte Community Association is now taking applications for two scholarship

The first award, for \$1,000, is offered by the Charlotte Community Association and is funded by donations and various fundraising activities. U.S. NAVY SEABEES 75th Anniversary by Jack Tangen

"CAN DO" has been the motto of the U.S. Navy Construction forces, known as the "Seabees" for the past 75 years. Rochester native and retired Seabee, EQCM (Equipment Mechanic Master Chief) John Cubit, has built and fought around the world as a member of various **Construction Battalions and** Maintenance units. Chief Cubit worked as a Heavy Equipment mechanic and project manager during his 28 years of service in the Seabees.

The Seabees were officially established on March 5th, 1942. Many of the jobs in the Seabees have remained the same since WWII, when the Seabees paved the 10,000 mile road to victory for the allies in

the Pacific Theatre and in Europe. The Seabees were the only military unit to be involved in every offensive amphibious landing during WWII.

Update: New York State Senate Joe Robach Italian-American State Legislators College Scholarships

am pleased to announce that the New York Conference of Italian-American State Legislators is now accepting applications for four \$3,000 scholarships, which will be awarded in June at their Annual Legislative Conference Day.

Given the high costs of college, every opportunity must be made by students and their families to meet their required expenses with scholarships, student loans, financial aid and personal contributions. Of this year's four \$3,000 scholarships, two will be based academically and two athletically. Eligibility is judged upon the student's grade point average, interest in pursuing a higher education, extra-curricular activities, and involvement in the local community, as well as individual financial need.

The Conference of Italian-American State Legislators is a bipartisan organization of New York State Assembly and Senate members who are actively involved in promoting and celebrating the state's Italian-American community. The mission of the conference is to work to elevate and highlight Italian-American contributions to the State of New York and beyond, in all aspects of society, including literature, the arts, architecture and politics.

Update: New York State Assembly Joe Morelle Reforming STAR

n March, I was proud to join my colleagues in the Assembly in passing legislation reforming the state's School Tax Relief (STAR) program to roll back barriers to fair, timely tax relief.

Advancing programs and policies that ease the tax burden on New York's hardworking families continues to be one of my top priorities. Unfortunately, the changes made to the STAR program in 2016, including switching administration of the program over to the state Department of Taxation and Finance instead of local assessors and altering how certain homeowners receive their tax relief, resulted in far too many headaches for homeowners. Countless New Yorkers reported receiving their checks much later than they were supposed to or even receiving ones for an amount that fell far short from what it should have been, leaving hardworking families in a bind and making it difficult for them to pay their school tax bill on time.

The Assembly legislation that I cosponsored (A05969) reverses these changes and transitions the program back to the way it was, providing all homeowners with their deserved tax relief upfront as a reduction in their school tax bill. Administration of the program would also be returned to the hands of local assessors and, further, the bill requires the state to help localities in notifying residents of these new changes so that all qualified homeowners receive the exemption. It is my hope that this legislation will resolve the outstanding issues and ensure the STAR program continues to provide the maximum benefit to New York's homeowners.

Update: Molly Clifford Northwest City Council Member City of Rochester, Climate Action Plan

he Rochester Police Department has come out with two important reports recently; one evaluating the Patrol Reorganization; the other looking at policecommunity relations. Unquestionably, the role and effectiveness of the police are always hot topics and this year is no different. I would encourage you to personally read these reports, which you can find online at cityofrochester.gov/RPDOpenData/ and search "evaluation" (hmmm, perhaps we could have made that a little easier!).

We are very fortunate to have great partners in the Lake Section and Northwest Neighborhood Service Center. I know I am not the only one who appreciates Capt. Dearcop, Lt. Koehn, and their team's regular attendance and involvement at our neighborhood meetings, as well as their diligence in addressing problems about which residents are concerned. They have incredibly difficult jobs with nearly impossible expectations.

A few points were raised in the evaluations that continue to be of concern. Despite one of the promises of the reorganization, police staffing levels continue to be too low. Retirements, officers out on leave and temporary assignment have left the department unable to do much in the way of proactive work, as much as they may want to do it. While we have one new recruit class in the field and another one scheduled, we need to make sure the RPD is and continues to be fully staffed.

Another area of concern is the fact that most citizens and police officers surveyed reported that they had not seen much in the way of improvement in policecommunity relations over the past year. Both groups cited the aforementioned problems with staffing levels, and the delay in implementing the promised section offices, as the reasons for the lack of progress in this area.

While these particular results are disappointing, I remain hopeful that given the desire of the police and many in the community to work together, things will improve. I am looking forward to helping make this happen!




