A Charrette for the Port of Rochester Is Finally Going To Happen!!

or more than two years the CCA has been working with the Community Design Center Rochester (CDCR) to secure funding for a charrette for Charlotte. With support from the City of Rochester, a charrette specifically to plan the future Port of Rochester is finally going to become a reality this year.

char·rette /SHəˈret/

A public meeting or workshop devoted to a concerted effort to solve a problem or plan the design of something.

The Charlotte Community first learned of the charrette process on March 30, 2015 where the CDCR consultants explained the processes, the cost and their successes in creating and achieving changes in other Rochester neighborhoods such as Maplewood and Cornhill. (See CCA Newsletter of May, 2015. Go to www.charlottecca.org, click Newsletters then May, 2015 Newsletter.)

A charrette is a comprehensive planning process that brings the community together to plan what we want our designated space to look like in the future. In this case, the space will be the Port of Rochester, and the whole community is invited to participate in the process. The results of our planning will be shared with the City as a blueprint of what we want in our neighborhood.

The charrette process will launch in May 2017 and will take about 6 months to complete. It will involve community leaders from many neighborhood groups who will steer the process, guided by design professionals from CDCR, and it will be open to everyone. This charrette for the Port will be a partnership between the CCA as the "team," CDCR as the "coach," and the City as the "sponsor."

We are excited!! This is our golden opportunity to come together as a community and create a collective vision of what we want to see in development at the Port. More information will be coming soon, so watch for it!

Raising Awareness for Breast Cancer Screening this Mother's Day

s we get closer to Mother's Day on Sunday, May 14th, I am working with organizations in our community to remind women over the age of 40 that they should get screened for Breast Cancer. In this effort to raise awareness, I am proud to support and take part in the Breast Cancer Coalition of Rochester's 15th Annual "Pink Ribbon Run and Family Fitness Walk." This event features a Women's 5k Race and a 2.3 or 3.6 mile Family Fitness Walk. Every dollar that is raised for this event stays in our Rochester community to benefit the lives of those impacted by breast cancer. This years' event is taking place on Mother's Day, Sunday, May 14th at 9am at Genesee Valley Park at the Roundhouse. Registration begins at 7:15 am and you can learn more information by calling the Breast Cancer Coalition at 473-8177 or by visiting www.bccr.org.

I was also proud to support a new law that requires extended hours for screening at 210 hospital-based mammography facilities access the state. It also eliminated insurance hurdles for mammograms and other screening and diagnostic imaging procedures to detect breast cancer.

From information compiled by the Breast Cancer Coalition of Rochester, nearly 3 million women across the United States are now living in the aftermath of a breast cancer diagnosis and breast cancer is the 2nd most common cancer diagnosis among women. The biggest risk factor for breast cancer is being a woman and getting older. Most women who find their own breast cancer do so as part of normal routines; however, it is still critically important to be screened because true prevention means stopping breast cancer before it develops. Update: Molly Clifford Northwest City Council Member City of Rochester, Climate Action Plan

There has been a lot of interest in the future of Parcel 5, the center of the old Midtown Plaza site. The City has gone out to bid twice over the past few years, with no acceptable bids received in the first Request for Proposal (RFP) process and four submitted last fall (one developer withdrew from the process fairly early on).

The RFP process has traditionally been a City Administration function, with staff from each potentially impacted department researching and reviewing proposals. The City Council generally does not get involved until later, in an attempt to keep the process free of politics and centered on the economic and other merits of each proposal.

At the March City Council meeting, more than a dozen people spoke on behalf of Visionary Square, a

proposal submitted by a volunteer organization that would keep the open space, with flexible programming from pop-up vendors to performance space throughout the year. People were passionate and engaged, always a good thing. Several speakers also spoke in favor of the Gallina Development proposal, a mixed-use project with residential, commercial and some open space included.

A week later, **Mayor Warren** announced that the winning proposal was one originally submitted by the Rochester Broadway Theatre League for a downtown Performing Arts Center, with the lateentry housing partnership with Morgan Management and partially funding from **Thomas Golisano**.

While there is excitement around this proposal and its potential impact on downtown, there are some substantial questions. Complete funding for the project has not been identified. It is a markedly different proposal from the one originally submitted, calling the RFP process into question. It is not clear what the impact will be on other community theatres, including Kodak Theatre on the Ridge and the Auditorium Theatre.

My colleagues and I are anxious for answers. I would be interested in your thoughts as well.




