Post-Charrette Report Shared With The Community

preliminary report on the findings from the November 2017 charrette was shared with the community at the CCA meeting on Monday, February 5th by the Community Design Center Rochester (CDCR). Highlights of the report include the historic context of the Port and surrounding areas that were studied, and a closer look at how the area looks right now. We learned about the demographics of our neighborhood and how that might impact decisions about development going forward. The final report will be made available later this month via a link on the CCA website under the Community Development tab.

We learned that several common ideas surfaced from every one of the groups studying the six focus areas. Among those were the need to diversify transportation options to maximize connectivity with downtown and other surrounding neighborhoods, the desire for attractions that will bring people into the area on a year-round basis, the desire to change Lake Avenue north of Pattonwood Dr. into a safe and welcoming portal to the Port area, and the need to provide parking alternatives while preserving public access to the beach and harbor. Lots of great ideas and positive energy emerged from the 70+ people who participated on charrette day along with 25+ volunteer facilitators from CDCR.

With a promise of support on charrette day from Mayor Lovely Warren, NYS Senator Joe Robach, and NYS Assemblyman Joe Morrelle, the community has a bright future ahead. The Charrette Steering Committee, comprised of 17 active community volunteers, will continue to lead the work that has just begun. The committee will identify common interests and priorities that emerged from the charrette and then set short- and long-term goals that will create a community vision plan for the future.



Introducing Linda Litwak New Board Member


am a Rochester native, growing up in Greece but always coming to the Charlotte beach. My first job, even as a teenager, was a waitress at LDR Char Pit.

t's that time of year again as college-bound seniors start their search for financial aid.

This year the **Charlotte Community Association** (CCA) is pleased to announce that two scholarships will be awarded to college-bound students who are residents of the Charlotte community or attend the Leadership Academy for Young Men.

The Association will award one \$2,000 award which is made possible through community fundraising and membership donations.

Another award of \$2,000 is provided by a fund created in memory of **Edward Watson**, a Charlotte resident and former Charlotte High student.

The requirements for both scholarships are the same and will be coordinated by the CCA Scholarship Committee. Update: New York State Senate Joe Robach

Taking Action to Protect Taxpayers

ecently, my colleagues and I at the State Senate njoined together to take action to protect millions of New York taxpayers from \$1.5 billion in higher taxes, preventing Albany bureaucrats from getting a huge windfall of your hard-earned tax dollars.

By modifying New York law to address recent changes in the federal tax code, our bill will prevent \$1.5 billion in higher taxes from being imposed on New Yorkers starting next year. If action is not taken, that money will go directly into state coffers, instead of to hardworking taxpayers like you.

The bill, which is part of the Senate Majority's "Affordability Agenda," will:

- ◆ ·Save approximately \$400 million by allowing taxpayers to deduct their full property tax payments and save approximately \$300 million by restoring other deductions;
- ◆ ·Save \$800 million by ensuring that more than 5 million single filers can claim their full New York State standard deduction; and
- ◆ ·Save \$45 million by removing the existing state prohibition on itemizing a state income tax return if a taxpayer chooses to take the new higher federal standard deduction.

This important measure, including the entire "Affordability Agenda" included in our Blueprint for a Stronger New York, will provide the working men and women of our state with the tax relief they need and deserve.

I will be sure to keep you posted on our efforts to get this important taxpayer protection legislation enacted into law.

Update: Molly Clifford Northwest City Council Member

here has been a lot of activity (or inactivity, depending on your perspective) in the world of Rochester's sports stadiums lately. Since both Frontier Field and Capelli Sports Stadium are located in the Northwest Quadrant and employ thousands of local residents in seasonal and other positions, the issue is of particular interest to our neighbors.

Frontier Field is owned by Monroe County and leased to Rochester Community Baseball and the Red Wings. While the City Council has no oversight of the facility, certainly its future is important to all of us. The Red Wings are a successful franchise; Triple A teams are in high demand and they provide affordable family-friendly entertainment downtown to hundreds of thousands of Rochester families each year. Let's lock this down, Monroe County!

The City's soccer stadium is a more complicated animal. The good news? The stadium construction is paid

off. The bad news? It was not built with many of the enhancements that make it appealing; some design flaws make it expensive to operate. Although the neighborhood has really turned around, it has been a struggle to get visitors over the initial idea that it was rundown and dangerous, despite being a scant three blocks from Frontier Field.

Additionally, the leadership of the Rhinos has historically been far less consistent than the Red Wings' with financial and ethical challenges. **David and Wendy Dworkin**, local business people with a love of sports and a commitment to the community, have spent the last two years trying to get the stadium up to snuff, attracting events and sponsors, participating in neighborhood activities and investing their own money in the process.

Unfortunately, stadium attendance was not what they needed it to be and the Dworkins have suspended Rhinos' team play for the upcoming season; to be substituted with other soccer matches and events. This has led the City Administration to declare a contract default and a notice of eviction to save money on facility costs and enable the pursuit of a new operator.

The next step will involve lawyers, which is too bad (no offense, lawyers). I would have liked to have seen the City try to come to an agreement with our local owners that recognizes the challenges of the stadium, the investments they've made and creates a joint commitment on a path forward for long-term success and sustainability of the stadium.






