Charrette Report Is Now Available!

The final report of the Port of Rochester and Charlotte Community Charrette Day is now available on the CCA website: http://www.charlottecca.org/community-development/charrette-process/. This comprehensive, 88-page report is a documentation of the community-planning day that was held on November 4, 2017. It outlines the geographical area that was studied and provides a historic and present-day context for each of the six designated areas that were focused on within the study area. It also includes the ideas and original drawings that resulted from each of 12 different workgroups.

A new post-charrette steering committee of about 40 community volunteers has formed and will be working intensively over the next several months to create a new vision plan for Charlotte. The vision plan will be published and become the blueprint of what the community wants to see in development for the

study area. The work involves analyzing the charrette report to identify common and unique ideas, investigate feasibility and develop and long- and short -term goals for making them become a reality.

Update: Molly Clifford Northwest City Council Member

Atrina Korfmacher, PhD, is the Director of the Community Outreach and Engagement Core at the University of Rochester's Environmental Health Sciences Center and Associate Professor in the Department of Environmental Medicine. She has done a great deal of work with the City of Rochester, particularly in the area of lead-paint poisoning prevention. Thanks to her work and her continued commitment to the City, she has also helped us keep an eye on the environmental health impacts of many of our major projects, including our new Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) and what will likely be an outgrowth, the "Roc the Riverway" project.

Dr. Korfmacher invited me to participate in a Health Impact Assessment in 2013, which looked at ways that Rochester's LWRP and riverfront redevelopment could promote community health. Examples included:

- New "green infrastructure" designed to capture storm water, can both reduce pollution in our river and beaches and provide spaces for physical activity during dry weather.
- ◆Trail development design and signage can maximize access by low-income neighborhoods, providing a free transportation and exercise resource.
- ◆ Public education about safety in all projects that promote use of the river can reduce risk of injury.
- ◆ Enhancing waterfront gathering spaces increasing public access (both visual and physical) to the waterfront for people of all abilities can help build community connections and reduce stress.

"Taken together, obesity, cardiovascular disease, stroke and diabetes are the leading causes of death in Monroe County and are of particular concern among low-income residents in the City of Rochester," Korfmacher says. "Changes along the waterfront may affect the health of people who live nearby, those who visit the waterfront, and the general population by impacting their opportunities to exercise, access to active transportation, changes in physical safety, and places to come together as a community."

I am looking forward to working with Dr. Korfmacher and other public health advocates to ensure that the enormous potential of Roc the Riverway and the LWRP is shared with all of our residents.
