New Charlotte Community Vision Plan Unveiled For the Port of Rochester and Surrounding Areas

The Community Development Committee of the Charlotte Community Association (CCA) presented a preview of its Vision Plan for the future of the Port of Rochester and surrounding areas at the CCA's monthly meeting on September 10. The Vision Plan is the second phase of the community planning process that began on November 4, 2017 with a Charrette. The Committee was charged to analyze the ideas presented in the Charrette Report and prioritize them into short-term, mid-range and long-range goals. The Vision Plan identifies the community's highest priorities for development as:

- ◆ Restructure the Lake Avenue corridor north of Pattonwood Drive;
- ◆ Add new mixed-use terraced buildings with residential and commercial spaces and canopy parking;
- Add boutique hotels and boatels;
- Add an indoor water park;
- ◆ Create a skating rink (ice skating in winter; roller skating in summer);
- ◆ Add a new parking garage;
- ◆ Add a light-rail trolley system or repurpose the existing CSX tracks;
- ◆ Add a waterfront *sightseeing* ferris wheel;
- Preserve view sheds that do not interfere with the working lighthouse beam;
- ◆ Add an aquarium that also houses a maritime museum and Great Lakes education/research center;
- ◆ Add a new pedestrian-only ferry service to Lake Ontario ports;
- Repurpose the existing RR terminal to create a transportation hub;
- Winterize Ontario Beach Park pavilions for year-round rent with kitchens, bathrooms and fireplaces.
