## Community Vision Plan to be included in new RFP for Parcel 1

**B**ased on feedback received after its preliminary rollout in September, *The Charlotte Community Vision Plan for the Port of Rochester and Surrounding Areas* has been revised and will be included in a new Request for Proposals (RFP) being released by the City, **Baye' Muhammad**, Commissioner of Neighborhood and Business Development. As reported at the October CCA meeting, the new RFP will solicit proposals specifically for development of Parcel 1 at the Port of Rochester. Parcel 1 encompasses the public land bordered east to west by the marina up to Lake Avenue and north to south, Corrigan St. to Portside Drive.

According to the Commissioner, the RFP will include links to the 2018 Community Vision Plan and the 2017 Charrette Report. These documents identify the community's highest priorities for development at the Port, North River Street, the Lake Avenue corridor and Ontario Beach Park. They also address concerns about transportation in general and making the neighborhood a year-round destination.

In preparation for the RFP release on October 12, 2018, the CCA's Community Development Committee went to work revising the Vision Plan according to feedback received and also prepared a brief document summarizing the ideas specific to Parcel 1. These documents are posted on the CCA website.

## Update: New York State Senate Joe Robach

Providing Property Tax Relief for Homeowners

The 2018 Legislative Session was a continuation of my efforts to make the goal of home ownership more affordable for all New Yorkers. As part of my Blueprint for a Stronger New York, the Senate passed a series of bills that would:

- ◆ Reduce and eliminate local Medicaid contributions, opening the door to billions of dollars in tax relief for homeowners;
- ◆ Provide a 25-percent increase in STAR benefits for \$330 million in savings next year and \$1 billion annually by 2020;
- ◆ Deliver \$280 million in energy tax savings; and
- ◆ Double the retirement exemption for seniors.

In addition to these Senate-approved measures, I helped provide homeowners with approximately \$3.7 billion in property tax relief in this year's budget, by:

- ◆ Fully funding New York's essential STAR and Enhanced STAR programs, providing \$2.7 billion in property tax relief for millions of middle-class families and senior citizens statewide;
- ◆ Rejecting the Governor's plan to impose a cap on STAR program savings, a proposal that would have cost homeowners approximately \$50 million;

- ◆ Doubling the funding for property tax relief checks, increasing the total from roughly \$450 million to just under \$1 billion. This move will lead to an average check-size of \$380 per homeowner this year and \$532 next year; and
- ◆ Once again, securing record aid for our schools, a record \$29 billion investment (including STAR) that both helps our teachers and students statewide succeed and helps to hold the line on property tax hikes.

Making New York more affordable and providing better opportunities for the people who live here is critically important and has always been one of my top priorities. These measure are a step in the right direction and will help provide you and your family with needed tax relief.

**A**s you have undoubtedly heard, the City Administration recently released a new Request for Proposal for the old parcels one and two at the Port: [www.cityofrochester.gov/RFP4752LakeAve/](http://www.cityofrochester.gov/RFP4752LakeAve/). The site runs from the east side of Lake Avenue to N. River St., between Corrigan St. and Portside Dr.

We do not have to re-hash the several decades of controversy related to this site, except to say that out of that controversy has come some remarkable progress. The Marina and associated improvements have brought tens of thousands of new visitors to the area; we have more businesses at the Terminal building and more commercial interest than we've had in years and we have a neighborhood association actively engaged in the process.

All of that takes a lot of hard work and I believe we would be remiss if we didn't thank the people who have brought us to this point. I would leave people out if I named names, but from the City staff who have worked on the project for years under different Mayors and difficult circumstances, to the leaders and members of the Charlotte Community Associations and business associations who worked very hard to set their differences aside to work toward this point – thank you all!!

We wish him the best of luck as he represents the Charlotte Community Association at the ROC MNBN monthly meeting. 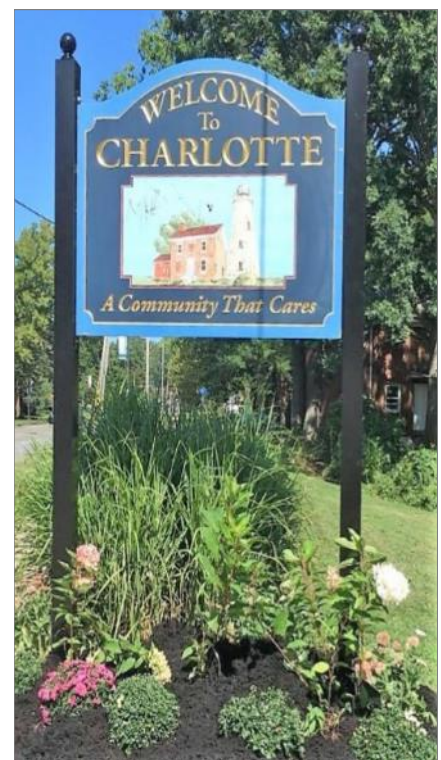
