his year, the Charlotte Community
Association (CCA) is pleased to announce
that two scholarships will be awarded to
college bound students who are residents of



the Charlotte community or attend the Leadership Academy for Young Men.

The CCA will award one \$2,000 award which is made possible through community fundraising and membership donations.

Another award of \$2,000 is provided by a fund created in memory of Edward Watson, a Charlotte resident and former Charlotte High student.

The requirements for both scholarships are as follows: To qualify for the Edward Watson Scholarship the college-bound senior must attend the Leadership Academy for Young Men (formerly Charlotte High School). To qualify for the CCA Scholarship the college-bound senior must reside in the Charlotte neighborhood and attend any school, public or private. All applications will be reviewed by the Scholarship Committee

For many years, the Charlotte Community Association has offered scholarships to students who qualify based on academics, community service and extra-curricular activities. We are pleased to continue this tradition as well as help facilitate with the Edward Watson Scholarship.

Applications will be available for both scholarships at the Charlotte Branch Library and online at the CCA website (charlottecca.org).

ayor Lovely Warren appointed La'Ron Singletary as the next Chief of Police to command the Rochester Police Department on Tuesday, April 9th, 2019. The Charlotte Community Association, Inc. (CCA) has had the pleasure of working with La'Ron over the past few years and we send him our congratulations on being appointed Chief of Police. We look forward to continuing our partnership with the Rochester Police Department and Chief Singletary.

"At 38 years old, Singletary becomes one of, if not, the youngest chiefs to ever lead the Rochester Police Department."

Singletary joined the force in 2000, rising through the ranks to become Deputy Chief in January 2018. He is a graduate of Monroe Community College and

Keuka College with degrees in criminal justice and law enforcement administration. He earned his masters in public administration from the College at Brockport SUNY.

Singletary, who was born and raised in Rochester, wiped tears from his face as he spoke during a mid-morning news conference at City Hall; "I'm excited and eager to begin this next chapter of my career, as you can tell," he said. "These are tears of joy...and

The CCA is very supportive of Singletary's appointment as Chief of Police and look forward to City Council's approval of his appointment at their June council meeting.



Rochesterians young and old, COME to the shores of Lake Ontario to celebrate the art of kite flying.


Sunday, May 5, from 11:00 a.m. – 3:00 pm at Ontario Beach Park.


Candidates for Rochester City Council in all four Quadrants that are set to appear on the primary ballot scheduled for vote on June 25th, 2019 have been invited to attend.

RCSD an F: What to Do?

ith the release of the NYS Department of Education's Distinguished Educator's report several months ago, many in the Rochester area have been engaged in another round of intense discussions about the future of the Rochester City School District. (If you haven't seen the report, you can find it online at www.nysed.gov). And with good reason – our schools are failing, and our children continue to be at risk. We are seeing the impact of 30 years of declining schools all around us: poverty, unemployment, hopelessness.

There is too much blame to go around to spend time any time blaming. I believe we have "failure fatigue," in which we throw up our hands, talk about all of the times we've tried to do different things without result, and try not to think about it.

My greatest fear is that when we cannot agree on a path, we nibble around the edges – again. We need major structural change. When was the last time we had major structural change in this community that wasn't forced upon us? I've lived here my whole life and I can't point to much. Perhaps when the City went to a strong Mayor system, in 1985?

In my view, the past thirty years have shown that the current District governing model doesn't work, and I don't think Mayoral control is the answer. City government has its hands full and little expertise in education. It also suffers from some of the same problems the district has: bureaucracy, partisanship and a top heavy administration.

I never thought I would advocate for State government intervention in any arm of local government, but desperate times call for desperate measures. We need educational leadership without agendas, histories, or toxic relationships. We need to focus on the Distinguished Educator's central theme: leadership whose priorities are the children, not the adult.

The CCO is responsible to oversee all official communications of the Association including:


- the newsletter, website, social media and general correspondence of the Board of Directors;
