Rochester Police Department (RPD) – Capt. Ray Dearcop

- No major incidents in the past month
- There was a question presented previous regarding staffing in Charlotte. Staffing changes frequently according to need. Charlotte is a generally quiet area and the greatest need may be elsewhere but we have the option to move people around to where they are needed most.
- There will be no substation in Charlotte proper, our section will be stationed eventually at Lake and Ridge.
- RPD continues to enforce speeding with the help of tactical, sheriff and state police.
- Memorial Day plans. RPD will cover much as last year, less help from the sheriff as they will be working another high-profile event.
