

### Charlotte Community Committee Update–June 2018

### Port of Rochester & Charlotte Community Vision Plan in Development

The CCA's Community Development Committee is creating a new long-term vision plan for Charlotte. It will become the blueprint to show the City and potential developers what the community wants for the

future of the Port and surrounding areas. The committee has been meeting twice monthly since March and working with graduate students from an Urban and Regional Planning class from RIT's Architecture program. An analysis of the results from the community design charrette that happened in November 2017 is almost completed. The next steps are to select the most

desirable ideas to pursue, map them out visually and investigate the feasibility. The Committee hopes to present the new vision plan to the community in the fall.

have recruited some future fire fighters to help protect our city. RPD Patrol officers also shared a few tips with the young men before they had to return to class.



Update: New York State Senate Joe Robach Fighting the Heroin & Opioid Epidemic

**M** y colleagues and I in the State Senate recently approved a legislative package that focuses on strengthening laws to stop drug dealers and others who are profiting from the deadly heroin epidemic that continues to grip our state.

These bills include stronger penalties for big-time drug dealers selling heroin, as well as for fraudulent medication prescriptions that fuel opioid addictions; measures to protect dealers from preying on children; and legislation that expands the types of dangerous controlled substances that can be regulated by the state, among others.

The measures stem from extensive input received by New York's law enforcement community, health professionals, former addicts, and others who have been impacted by the opioid epidemic and participated in the Senate's Joint Task Force on Heroin and Opioid Addiction forums and initiatives.

I am proud to have helped deliver record new investments in heroin and opioid prevention, treatment, and recovery. Now it is time for the Governor and Assembly to recognize the critical role that law enforcement and effective regulation can play in preventing drugs from entering our communities.

I am urging the Assembly and the Governor to stop delaying and act this Session to protect our kids and put dangerous dealers behind bars. This common-sense legislation will make a life-saving difference for New Yorkers.

I will be sure to keep you posted on my continued efforts.

Update: New York State Assembly Joe Morelle Confronting Violence and Abuse

O ver the past several weeks, the State Assembly has taken bold actions to address domestic violence, strengthen protections for crime victims and ensure justice for victims of childhood abuse.

The impacts and consequences that confront victims of violence and abuse can devastate and alter the course of their lives forever. We must do all that we can to ensure victims are treated with compassion and dignity and are able to obtain the justice they deserve and the support they need.

That is why I was proud to vote in support of a comprehensive legislative package that will help to ensure that victims of domestic violence have a pathway to obtaining justice and accessing the resources they need to reclaim their lives.

I also helped pass legislation that enhances support for crime victims, including measures to protect victims of human trafficking, broaden the definition of rape to ensure justice for survivors of sexual assault and protect individuals who report crimes.

Additionally, I worked to help pass the Child Victims Act which extends the Statute of Limitations and provides adult survivors of childhood sexual abuse with the opportunity to hold their abusers accountable in civil court.

These legislative actions are important steps forward for our state; accordingly, we must continue doing more and never stop fighting, thereby, ensuring justice and providing peace of mind for all victims.

### Update: Molly Clifford Northwest City Council Member

There are a number of new resources available on the City website that make it easy for people to learn more about what's going on in their neighborhoods and across the city. Check them out on www.cityofrochester.gov!

There is a new button on the home page, Government Transparency, where you can find much of the information you might be looking for. A new program called "Building Blocks" will give you much more information on individual properties in the city, including: Vacancy, Business Permit, Open Code Enforcement Cases, Crime Data, Water Bills, Real Estate Sales, Monroe County Foreclosure Starts (Lis Pendens), Owner vs. Renter, Building Size, Assessed Values, City Owned, Year Built, Lot Size, and Census data. While the program is pretty self-explanatory, there is also a training video to help walk you through it if you need it.

One area that has frustrated me is trying to keep track of the cases and decisions of the various volunteer land-use boards – Planning Commission, Preservation Board, Zoning Board of Appeals, etc. There is a new part of the website dedicated to these boards and their applications, decisions and supporting materials. It's great to have it all in one place.

Also new and something helpful for those of us who wonder about what happened to all of the plans the City has done and continues to do is the "Projects and Plans" section of the website. If you search that title on the home page (no button yet), you will be directed to a page that assembles decades' worth of Development Plans, Street Projects, Environmental Sustainability studies, and other plans and studies conducted by the City.

All of these tools are a great first step for people who have questions but may not know where to turn. They are also works in progress, so if you have suggestions or find misinformation, please contact the City representatives who are listed on each site.


