The Charlotte Community Association, Inc. (CCA) would like to THANK Sgt. Ontario Beach Park Performance Pavilion Renamed







"Dynamic Staffing" or "Brown-Outs"

Rochester City Council Member

une is budget time for City Council and, by the time you read this, a new City budget will have been passed. Without question, the budget for the Rochester Fire Department (RFD) drew the most criticism for the inclusion of cost savings realized by "dynamic staffing" or "brown -outs." As of this writing, I am hopeful that the opposition expressed by the public and many members of Council has led to a compromise that is acceptable to all.

City Council and Mayor Warren heard loud and clear the support for the RFD and the unwillingness to save money by putting citizens at risk. We are very fortunate to have a highly professional responsive fire department and we want to keep it that way. While Council was told that Engine 19 (the Lake Avenue fire house) would never be "browned out" because of its location and the geography of Charlotte, there

was not enough confidence that Charlotte's backup stations at Dewey & Ridgeway or N. Clinton would continue to be as available as they are now.

New Rochester Police Department Chief La'Ron Singletary was also confirmed in June. There is a lot of community support for Chief Singletary, thanks to the relationships he built as a Crime Prevention Officer in NET/Neighborhood Service Centers, and throughout his career. He was born and raised in the city and it was notable to read in his references the number of people who commented that he was "born to be Chief." I am optimistic that Chief Singletary will help lead the Police Department and the community through challenging times with honesty, respect and a steady hand.



The caravan will start at 1099 Jay Street at 5:30 PM and travel through the neighborhoods to Ontario Beach Park.




