The Scholarship Committee assigns a weight to each of these categories and independently scores each application.

CYAA (2019 season review)

ell, baseball fans, the Charlotte Youth Athletic Association (**CYAA**) 2019 season (its 66th) is in the books! I'm happy to report that 185 boys and girls ages 4-12 and their families were able to have a fun filled baseball season.

The kids and parents came to one of five registration dates in March at Holy Cross School cafeteria. In mid - April, parents or guardians of each registered child attended our Parent meeting to welcome all, go over general information, rules, and age group specific league information. By April, players started at our Ontario Beach Park baseball fields. Within 2 weeks each player was evaluated for skills within their age group, divided into teams, uniforms distributed (hat, jersey, and baseball socks) and then, divided into evenly matched teams. *Let the games begin!* And so they did - regularly, twice a week, Monday through Saturday; from early May to the middle of July.

Players were able to participate in a Skills Challenge Day - testing their hitting, throwing and running skills for each age group. Each player received a participation medal, and the top 3 finishers in each skill received a 1st 2nd or 3rd place medal. A free lunch for players and parents were provided by **CYAA** and our friends at the **Ontario Beach Park Program Committee** (**OBPPC**).

The **CYAA** also partnered with the **Rochester Red Wings** to sell tickets to players and families to attend a Saturday night game on June 29th at Frontier Field. The kids got to walk on the field prior to the game and saw fireworks after the game.

Each age group finished their regular season with a


Trophy and Pizza Night. All players received a trophy. Players and families were invited to pizza and a drink, made possible by a generous donation from **Wegmans**.

Update: New York State Assembly Jamie. L. Romeo

This past Session, the New York State Legislature passed a significant number of bills, on a diverse set of topics. As an Assemblywoman entering her first year in office, it was a humbling and empowering experience to

represent the 136th District in what will be remembered as a historic year in our State's history. One of the legislative packages I am proud we took on and I voted YES on was voting reforms.

This past January several electoral process bills were passed, including early voting. Starting on October 26th until November 5th of this year, every voter will have access to 10 days of voting (9 days of early voting plus Election Day). These nine

days will include two full weekends and ensure that everyone will have time to get to the polls and fit voting into their already busy schedules. Voters will be able to choose from any of these locations near their home, school or workplace to vote from. For more information including voting sites, dates, and times the polls are open. In addition the NYS Legislature passed several other bills which provide drastically improved and expanded the voting process in our State. Combining the State and

Also, young New Yorkers who are 16 or 17 years of age now have the ability to preregister to vote, allowing them to automatically be activated into the voter rolls upon turning 18 years of age.

up and participate. With these new electoral reforms, I am hoping to see more voters at the polls this Fall.

Update: Molly Clifford, Northwest City Council Member

Draft Comprehensive Plan, Rochester 2034.

s you may have heard, the City of Rochester recently launched its draft comprehensive plan, *Rochester 2034*. The plan covers a wide variety of topics, from housing and transportation to economic growth and historic preservation. Each topic includes Goals and Strategies that are aligned with an overarching community Vision and set of Guiding Principles. Overall, the Plan presents a blueprint for growth and development. You can find it at https://www.cityofrochester.gov/Rochester2034/

To give you a sense of some of the things the comprehensive plan addresses, Healthi Kids, a local organization that focuses on the health, safety and well-being of Rochester's children, highlighted several initiatives that they are excited about so far:

- Improving our public parks and open spaces to support play for all ages and abilities;
- Activating vacant lots by creating playable spaces, and supporting community gardens;
- Enhancing neighborhood safety by

- incorporating Crime Prevention through Environmental Design principals in the built environment and future projects;
- Supporting the co-location of services at schools, recreation centers and libraries to ensure all residents and families have access to the services they need to thrive.

However, there are several other areas in which residents have expressed concerns. A more flexible approach to zoning, which can be positive in opening up different kinds of economic development opportunities, may conflict with some neighborhoods' desires to focus more on housing. I have also heard from some neighborhood organizations that they did not feel their ideas had been considered seriously.

There has been a public review and comment period, which has just come to a close. However, City Council will have to adopt this plan in the fall, so we remain open to suggestions. Please let me know what you think via email anytime at molly.clifford@cityofrochester.gov!

Charlotte Branch Library 1919-2019 ~ By Maureen Whalen

ust three years after the city annexed the village of Charlotte If from the town of Greece in 1916, the city opened the Charlotte Branch Library at 40 Stutson Street on September 5, 1919. The branch occupied what was formerly the village's fire house, and was the seventh in the municipal library system started in 1911,. Initially the library was only on the first floor, but in 1924 a children's room was established on the second floor.

It was well used and for many years also served residents of Irondequoit and Greece. The Branch was open every day of the year from 2-9 p.m. until the Great Depression - that put the library system in such dire financial straits that Charlotte Branch was going to be "wholly abandoned." Public sentiment saved it, but service was reduced to just six hours per week. By the end of the 1930s the branch was open six days a week; Sunday hours were never resumed.

In 1942 the city instituted a non-resident fee for users who did not reside in the city. The Charlotte librarians were unhappy with this as it meant that so many of their customers from the surrounding towns could no longer afford to use the library. This fee ended with the formation of the Monroe County Library System in 1952.

The critical issue of the 1950s for the Charlotte branch was the building itself. The director of the library system rated the Charlotte building as the "worst" in the system. A telephone

exchange building at the corner of Lake Avenue and Britton Road, no longer necessary when the Charlotte area switched over to direct-dial, became the branch's new home. It opened on March 16, 1961. It has thrived there ever since.

Over its hundred years the Branch has seen many changes and innovations: they've gone from hand-stamping due dates to charging out books on the computer. The card catalog made way for an on-line catalog and a website where people have 24/7 access to information. In 1961, only printed material was circulated; since then it has tried to provide many rapidly changing forms of media, keeping up with the times.

What hasn't changed is the feel of a village community library in the confines of the city, the friendliness of the staff, and the love that Charlotte has for its library. Happy birthday,

Charlotte Branch Library. May you have many more years of serving the community.




Pastor Ray Poling has been going to the Lake High Rise twice a month to preach the Word to those unable to come to church. He also provides refreshments.
