7:00 pm Call to order and Welcome.

CITY OF ROCHESTER UPDATES

Rochester Police Department – Lt. Waldo announced the new Lake Section police captain. Captain Dearcop is heading to RPD Special Op's and Capt. Nate Cornell will take command. June 1st is Capt. Cornell's first day on the west side of the city so he is getting to know the neighborhoods. Lt. Waldo discussed the previous weekend riots as they pertained to our neighborhood. He gave an update on damage and how they are planning on taking care of any further issues. We talked about the Memorial Day weekend and the crowds and issues. There had been allegations of shots fired at the beach on Sunday evening 5/24. There was no evidence to corroborate that happened. The issues on Memorial Day, 5/25 were dealt with swiftly and crowds were dispersed within 30 minutes. Capt. Dearcop took questions and Jose Peo brought up the break in and vandalism and burglary at the Chase Bank and Jerimiah's Computer at Lake Ave. & Denise Rd. They did not seem to be aware of these issues. Lt. Waldo asked Jose if he could request the City increase the lighting in the Beach Ave. Parking lots were the crowds congregate at night. That would improve safety. Lt. Waldo did say RPD is working on the issue of 295 N. LeMoyne. Further information will follow

Fire House – Captain Daly. Lots of calls along the river trail and water rescues.

NWNSC – Bruce Wilder and Tammy Herron. 25% of staff is working but they are beginning to reman the service center. There are currently 66 properties in the NW area that are in need of being boarded up due to damage from the protests.

City Council Jose Peo – Budget meetings are Wed. 6/3 and next Tues. Wed. & Thur. (6/9 - 6/11). Their budget will include the RCSD budget. Meetings will be broadcast on the COR Facebook page live. If you wish to speak to council email or call Jose to be put on the list. Problems with spray painted swastikas at Turning Point Park that need to be covered up immediately. Road replacement is underway for Burley to Pattenwood and Beach Ave.

RCSD –Leadership Academy – LAYM Entrepreneur Institute: RCSD Liaison Vaughn Collins is working with Jose Peo on an entrepreneurship class for students. He will try to utilize our area. Basics re: finance, social media, branding etc. Jose hopes to show students how to put together a business plan and present to the Charlotte businesses. This will be (2) 6-week sessions starting in the 2020/21 school year. 14-year olds with 95% attendance will be able to participate. They are still in the planning stages.

OBPPC – Fred Armato in for Jim Farr. Concerts by the Shore have been cancelled for this summer. The Robach Center is closed to the public. The August 15th presentation by the Antique Fire Association is still up in the air along with the fall schedule of the Big Band Dances. More to follow.

Charlotte Lighthouse Historical Society – Fred Amato The Lighthouse may be able to open in Phase 4 (July). They are checking to see if their volunteers will be comfortable coming back. Possibly open from July to October.



Monroe County Legislator – Yversha Roman stated that hairstylists, dentists and barbers are being provided face shields by the county for any of their workers. The county also has masks for business owners. The county budget (which is up in January) will most likely see a \$45 to \$85 million deficit.
