CITY OF ROCHESTER UPDATES

Rochester Police Department Lt. Rich Waldo

- 0 robberies, 0 assaults, 3 burglaries, 0 car break-ins, 2 stolen cars
- 21 dirt bikes have been confiscated and they are continuing to monitor this issue
- The "Fast and the Furious" are being dealt with. Many tickets have been written & 1 DUI arrest
- Lt. Waldo discussed the plan for Memorial Day weekend with MCSO
- Jose Peo asked about the shooting at 7/11. Capt. Cornell will check on that.

Fire House – Capt. Scott Daly Engine 19

- There was one large structure fire.
- The new rescue boat has arrived on May 3rd and will be in the Marina

NWNSC – Bruce Wilder

- Friday May 21st will have a give a-way of plants for planters. You can call the Service Center to sign up. Barbara Lake will check on this for these plants for Leadership Academy Garden.

Charlotte Lighthouse Historical Society – Fred Amato

- The lighthouse has received grants for some improvements.
- There are new exhibits in the museum.

- There is a survey coming up to find out what the community needs from the library.
