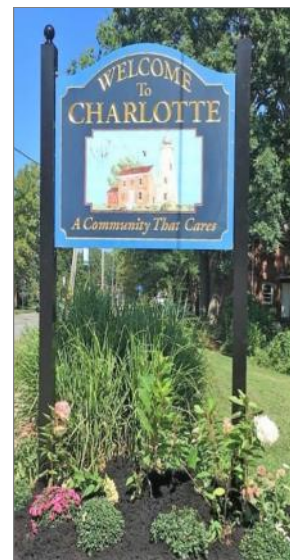

Each of our 12 committees has its own plan of work structured to execute the goals set by the board for the year. Each committee offers many opportunities for people to get involved, no matter how much time they wish to volunteer. All are welcomed!

Committee Plans of Work are posted on the CCA website at <https://charlottecca.org/>. Here is a list of the committees and primary goals for 2022:

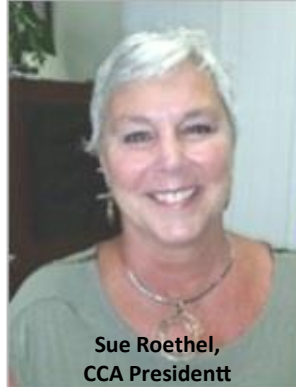
Beautification – Continue maintaining the many beautiful gardens throughout the neighborhood.

Business Alliance – Outreach to local businesses to become a CCA sponsor and engage with us regularly.

Communications – Identify a Communications Officer to serve on the Board of Directors. Update the CCA website content and explore best practices for getting our messages out to the community.

Community Development – Continue efforts to rehab the Robach Community Center; update the Community Vision Plan; study the changing demographics in Charlotte (based on the 2020 Census data).

Fundraising – Research grant opportunities and submit grant applications for specific projects.

Governance – Develop a Processes and Procedures guidebook.

Membership & Outreach – Develop an outreach campaign to grow the membership.

Nominating – Recruit candidates for Board of Directors (5 seats available); develop a succession plan.

Programming – Plan a calendar of events: Lakeside Winter Celebration in February; Clean Sweep and Kite Flight in May; Neighborhood Outreach in Summer; CCA Members' Picnic, National Night Out Picnic, and Scholarship Awards Ceremony in August; ROC the Riverway in October, and the Annual Tree Lighting in December. Other special events may be planned as well, if the pandemic allows.

Safety & Security – Continue participating with RPD and RFD; attend PCIC meetings; recruit community members to start a PAC-TAC in their neighborhood.

Scholarship – Continue offering the scholarship program for graduating seniors

Youth Engagement – Continue supporting the Leadership Academy for Young Men by growing the 4H program and sponsoring activities of the JROTC program. Also, make connections with School 42 and Holy Cross School.

Our success is dependent upon people like you who love Charlotte and are willing to volunteer their time.

Generally, when we hear the word “infrastructure,” we think of roads and bridges, mass transit—all critically important to the success of our community. However, the COVID-19 pandemic made clear that infrastructure must also include reliable access to childcare, healthcare, and solutions to our climate crisis. Making investments in our infrastructure means not only fixing roads and bridges—which we are successfully doing, thanks to the bipartisan infrastructure law I helped pass—but also investing in our human capital by creating jobs, uplifting working families, and making sure our children can thrive.

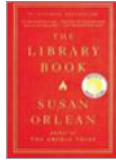


