City Council has approved the Senior Meals Program again, and if you would like to sign up for the program, please call 311. Three restaurants in Charlotte will participate in the meal program the Taste of the Bahamas, Brothers Chicken and Waffles and Karen's Lakeside Haven. If you are unaware of the Senior Meals Program, I will give you a little background.

The Senior Meals program provides three meals per week for qualified seniors in our community. The participating restaurants provide a menu to 311 and the senior can pick which restaurant they want to sign up for food delivery. The food is delivered by the restaurant free of charge to the senior. Last year the restaurants provided over 2000 meals in Northwest Rochester.

Finally, the **roofing grant program is now taking names of qualifying residents**. If you would like to see if you qualify for the roofing grant, please call the NW Neighborhood Service Center at (585) 428-7620.

Additionally, the NW Neighborhood Service Center has a new Administrator. **Mayor Evans** has appointed **Carlos Torres** as the new Administrator. Mr. Torres has 28 years of experience and was formerly the Administrator at the NE Neighborhood Service Center, and we welcome him to the NW.
