New Charlotte Development Collaborative Formed

A new stakeholder group has been formed to represent the many facets of community interests for development in the neighborhood of Charlotte. This group morphed from the CCA's Community Development Committee, which has been meeting regularly since the community design charrette held in 2017 for the Port of Rochester and surrounding areas.

The new stakeholder group, dubbed the Charlotte Development Collaborative, consists of members of major neighborhood organizations including: the Charlotte Community Association, Inc. (CCA); Charlotte Business Association (CBA); Charlotte Community Development Corporation (CCDC); Ontario Beach Park Program Committee (OBPPC); and Charlotte-Genesee Lighthouse Historical Society. It also includes representatives from the municipalities that are responsible for our neighborhood: City of Rochester/City Council (Northwest); City of Rochester/Northwest Neighborhood Service Center; Monroe County Legislature; Monroe County Parks Department; New York State Assembly; and New York State Senate.

In recent months the group's focus has been on responding to an out-of-town developer with roots in the Rochester region who has expressed interest in the plot of land at the Port of Rochester next to the marina. The land, formerly known as Parcel One, is now called the Marina Overlook Site at 4752 Lake Avenue. It runs west to east from Lake Avenue down to N. River Street at the marina, and north to south from Corrigan Street to Portside Drive. The Collaborative group has met with the developer to discuss what the community wants to see happen at that site. The group has also met with City of Rochester Neighborhood and Business Development officials to review options for development on that site and other sites in the surrounding areas. Discussions are ongoing, and there is currently no open Request for Proposals (RFP) in the surrounding areas.

Starting in January 2023, the Collaborative group will meet monthly to ensure that the community's wishes are well-represented in any discussions about development at the Port and surrounding areas. In fact, the group will be rolling out the final Charlotte Community Vision Plan that resulted from the charrette, which was a partnership of the CCA with the Community Design Center Rochester (CDCR). The Vision Plan, now in its final stages of refinement, showcases the ideas brought forth by the community for consideration in all current and future development opportunities.

In the next few months, the Collaborative group will plan public informational meetings to roll out the final Vision Plan and also plan to host an informational meeting just for potential developers to attend and discuss possibilities for the future. Regular updates on the Collaborative group's progress will be provided through each stakeholder group. The goal is to be inclusive and transparent each step of the way.

History of Charlotte's Blast Furnace

From 1868 until 1927, Charlotte's blast furnace was in operation for 59 years and a major area employer. Marie Poinan will chronicle each of its owners, including its only female owner, who owned the furnace from 1885-1893 and died in her Lake Avenue house in 1938. The program will also feature a number of Charlotte families that came to the area to work at the furnace and have stayed in the area for generations. Many of the Italian families can trace their origin back to the labor strike at the furnace in 1903, when striking workers were let go and the Italians were recruited to move to Charlotte to replace the fired workers.
