CITY OF ROCHESTER UPDATES

Rochester Police Department (RPD) - Officer Blanchard

RPD year to date has had 20 retirements. A couple of recruits resigned. Currently there is a posting for NW Lieutenant opening. Lt. Tamburella is temporarily covering two quadrants until the position can be filled.

PCIC meeting will be held on the 15th at 7 pm. It will be a zoom meeting and the link will be posted. Officer Blanchard clarified the difference between a priority call and a non priority call. In terms of response time, if there is a crime in progress; burglary or assault in progress, call 911 and report an emergency. If it has already occurred; I.e. lawn mower or bike was stolen from your shed, that will not be treated as a priority and response time might be slower. In a priority situation, if you get no response to the first call, call 911 again and ask to speak with a supervisor. The officer covering the Charlotte area is responsible for covering 490 to the beach.

Rochester Fire Department (RFD) Engine 19- Captain Todd Hodges

No one was present to report from Engine 19.

Northwest Neighborhood Service Center (NSC) - Anna Keller

Anna updated us on the Fukon salon on Lake Ave. At this time the spa is at a stand still. It cannot operate until it has acquired the appropriate permits so it will probably be awhile until it is approved for opening.

The city has emergency assistance available for qualifying residents who need their hot water heater and furnace replaced. If you have a need and meet certain income qualifications, you may be eligible for free, new replacements. Check the city website for more details or contact Anna's office at the number below.

Flower City Work Camp, a faith based organization that trains youth on the skills necessary to improve properties, including masonry, carpentry etc. are looking for for houses in need of repair. The house must be located in the city and be owner occupied. If you have a home in need of repair, please contact Anna's office at the number below. Jose Peo had some work done by them and highly recommends them and the quality of their work.

Anna also mentioned that, if you have a tree blocking your sight line call 311 and ask for Forestry to trim it back.

The city of Rochester school bus cameras should be available within the next month or so. First month only warning tickets will be issued to drivers who go around bus with stop signs extended. There is a new city action team handling non-violent, low priority, 911 calls. They have assigned 8 counselors with 1 months training to free up RPD officers to handle more serious calls. Annoyance calls like loud music would be handled by this team.

Wendell Lambert attended our meeting from assembly woman Sarah Clark's office. There is a \$25,000 grant available to improve the Bill Davis overpass but there is no timeline yet.

The Congress woman has been talking to the state about increasing safety on Lake Ave., proposal is for raised crosswalks (speed bumps) and increased lighting. Lake Ave is considered to be the most dangerous road per mile in the state with the highest fatal crash rate.

Life Span will be offering a seminar Empowered Aging Forum at MCC on 11/15 from 9 am to 2 pm on estate and funeral planning for seniors.
